

ATPAR (Alliance to Promote Abilities and Rehabilitation) is inspired by the spirit and motivation to transform traditional mindsets and dispel the myths on disability and build the abilities of persons with disabilities to become economically empowered, rehabilitated and be socially included to be seen as contributors 'at par' to the National wealth.

A large number of persons with disabilities are unable to access the job market and derive benefits from number of skill development and open employment opportunities. **ATPAR** a social enterprise was created to address this gap with a vision to offer opportunities for Entrepreneurship Development training, hand hold & provide mentorship support to set up enterprises, as an alternate livelihood solution for those left behind to become self-reliant members in the Society.

ATPAR collaborates with mainstream Government approved institutions like NIESBUD and NSIC to promote certified Entrepreneurship Development trainings for persons with disabilities and create accessible and inclusive trainings which are not just physically accessible, but also to enable them to deliver impactful training content which are simple and activity based and the participants are able to apply their learnings in their enterprises effectively.

In a span of two years ATPAR has imparted basic business knowledge and mentoring support to more than 150 persons with disabilities who are entrepreneurs or wish to start their own enterprises. The intense six day immersive sessions with practical experience in the NSIC Incubation Centre has motivated more than thirty person to start new business soon after training and about seventy percent has enhanced their incomes by applying their learnt knowledge.

This experience though very inspiring for all, there still exists many challenges in the ecosystem which still is not inclusive and has not allowed their business to grow and scale. The stakeholders Alumni Meet held on 14th April 2019 voiced the need to come together for a common purpose to strengthen each other and thus lead to create '**NEDAR' a Network of Entrepreneurs with Disabilities for Assistance & Rehabilitation – a Hindi word meaning 'Fearless'** which was symbolic of an entrepreneur who takes risk and more so inspite of being challenged with disabilities!

In this endeavour of ATPAR initiative PVR NEST the CSR arm of PVR Cinemas and Ummeed a Ray of Hope has partnered to strengthen the concept and work together to further its objectives for a year.

DEEPAK

"The world is full of good people, I met one such person who taught me electrical & electronic repair work. This knowledge helped me transform my life"

Inspite of the desire to go to school and continue my education beyond grade four my physical disability restricted my mobility and to make it worse, one day, my crutches too broke! The school struck off my name due to my prolonged absence! There were hardly any source of getting my assistive device repaired and getting a new one had its own process to apply!

After a year, I managed to get a battery operated tricycle which was a boon and helped me to freely roam around the city. One day while roaming in the market I saw an Electronics repair shop for TV and other domestic electronic appliances. This fascinated me; so I went upto the owner and requested if he could teach and train me in repairing and creating electronic products. He readily agreed and for two years I had been learning this skill from him and thereafter, felt confident to start an electronic shop of my own.

As I was looking for ways to set up a shop, I came to know about ATPAR through a friend. I got in touch and enrolled for the Entrepreneurship Development training with NSIC. During the EDP course there was a session on business ideas and the importance of finding something which a customer will need. That is when I came up with an idea to make Speakers. I made a prototype of a Blue Tooth Speaker with Emergency Light and a Mobile Phone Charger with Power Bank. This idea was well received by all and I was encouraged to set up a workshop from home for making Speakers. I am now happy with my business and am able to sell my speakers for use in Auto Rickshaws and E-Rickshaws. My dream is to set up a shop with proper equipments so that I can use my skills to scale up and earn a living and take care of my sisters and father and innovate new products useful to the society.

ARUN AGGARWAL


"Life has been a mixed bag of failure and success"

As a son of a post master living in a joint family I used to help with family earnings by working in a book binding shop when I was in my teens. I worked and continued to study and completed my B.Com. I got married and my wife brought with her, good luck and I soon started a corrugated box business by the name of "Ishwar Packers". The business did well for few years. Due to family problem and wife's deteriorating health I had to shut down the business. Post which I was doing odd jobs.

I came to know about ATPAR training in NSIC and decided to do it and gain additional knowledge. Today, thanks to better personal circumstances I have again ventured into business and have a factory in the name of " Shri Shyam Packers" and got GST registered. We manufacture card board boxes. This was possible because of the encouragement and mentoring by ATPAR. The EDP training is an extensive course and covers all aspects of training. We are taught to write business plan and look into all aspects of running a business starting from inventory to accounting, to Government Schemes and required licenses. I continue to be in touch with ATPAR and seek guidance.

"Confidence in self and risk taking ability are qualities that helped me succeed in life"

I belong to a poor family, living in Delhi for the past 11 years. I am happy that, today I and my family have moved out of the grips of poverty, because I was willing to take a risk. I run a garment manufacturing unit by the name RK Fashion. I enrolled in the 5 - day EDP course by ATPAR. It was here that I learnt about the importance of maintaining records. It was an eye opener and a learning that I immediately put into practice. I am ever thankful to ATPAR for this training and it has helped me keep track of my profit and losses and see that my business becomes sustainable. I have been able to expand my business and get more orders. I manufacture school uniforms, T shirts, Pants etc. I take up bulk orders. I dream of expanding my business and building capacity to be able to take up bigger orders and also a training institute so I can train many more.

RAJINDER MOHAN SHARMA

"After 20 years of working in a reputed company I ventured into the business of manufacturing cotton wicks. It's a lot of hard work, but very satisfying"

I literally reinvented myself at the age of 48 when I had to take early retirement from my job due to health reasons. I have worked with various organizations since 1996 in the area of Finance and Accounts. Lastly I worked with HT Media for about 11 years. I handled Finance, Accounts, Taxation, Day to Day finance operations, MIS, Payroll, Banks & Treasury, Audits, Vendor management etc. and worked in different Industries - Health, Media & Entertainment & Management Consultancy. I decided to get into business and did the training initiated by ATPAR at NSIC Incubation centre. In one of the sessions a video was shared on a buy back model of making cotton wicks (used for lamp / Diya's) at home.

Post EDP training and after lot of research I bought the machine and started 'DITI UDYOG' – for Manufacture of Diya Bati (Cotton Wicks) at home. I soon realized there is lot of demand in the market for the product and soon diversified into making different varieties of wicks. I also found out that handmade wicks are in demand. In order to expand the business and involve my family, my wife Mrs Santosh Sharma also underwent the ATPAR initiated NSIC EDP training. Both of us being orthopedically handicapped, find it easier to work out of home. While I do all the marketing and sourcing with my adapted Scooty, my wife takes care of the production. Since then we have actively looked at various opportunities for expanding the business both in retail / wholesale. Till date we have produced about 80 Kqs of cotton wick which was sold through buy back as well as retail channels and have achieved a monthly earning of about Rs. 10,000/.

I hope to expand the scope of the business by adding other products in the same category (Puja Samagri) and also by adding more machines to produce more Diya Bati. I also would like to involve other Persons with disabilities when I expand my business.

"I am an entrepreneur at heart and want to restart my Aluminum fabrication business which I had to shut down due to an accident at work"

I used to run a small unit of Aluminum fabrication, providing the service of fitting Aluminum and Glass doors, on contract basis. All that changed one day when I met with an accident while at work, having touched a live electric wire which was 11000 Volts and I got electrocuted. When I regained consciousness, I was in a hospital bed and had lost a hand and a leg. They had to be amputed. This left me devastated and I was not able to do anything for 2 years. That's when I came to know about ATPAR. I am glad that I decided to do the ATPAR EDP training at NSIC. It gave me hope. The training spoke about ways to get financial help to start one's business. I am now hoping to restart my Aluminum fabrication business in a new way. Till I am able to arrange funds, I will work on contract basis. My dream is to be an entrepreneur again!

Being a small-scale tailor, I was struggling to make ends meet. I never thought I could do anything more to improve the quality of my life. I knew I was good at my work but had no idea how to scale up business. That's when I came across ATPAR and the EDP training that they provide in NSIC. The training spoke about how to look at an existing skill and finding new ways to use them. They also spoke about sourcing raw material for lesser costs and to look at registering at places like "India mart" to source and sell products. This made me think big and I got together with a partner, bought 10 sewing machines and started a garment manufacturing unit.



Working or having a job was the only option I thought I had for years. Then a chance meeting with ATPAR mobiliser at a job fair, where they explained the concept of self - employability and becoming an entrepreneur, opened up new avenues. I enrolled for EDP training and plunged into the world of business. I was so charged up by what I learnt and business ideas discussed in class, that I bought a machine to make cotton wicks at home and started selling the wicks. This business I had to shut in a few months as I wasn't making enough money. I was bitten by the entrepreneur bug and I could not think of going back to a job. Business is what I wanted to do. I learnt from my mistakes and ventured into online business as I had some computer knowledge, I have studied up to 12th Class. Working online is a good option for me as my lower limbs are affected by Polio since childhood. I am enjoying being an online marketer and my earnings have shot up. My future plan is to expand my online business as well as have a shop for my local customers. This is not the end of my story I have a long way to go.

Anil Kumar recipient of NSIC Excellence Award for Entrepreneurs with Disabilities

Not having an industrial training and being just 10th pass, did not stop me from having big dreams. After working in Sheet Metal industry for about 5 years, I established my own Sheet Metal Unit called "Shyam Metal Works". I Started with hand press and progressively expanded to power press and other equipment's. I started to manufacture Metal Ring Seals for Drum Closures from my factory since 2003. I had to discontinue the manufacturing in the year 2014 due to deteriorating health condition of my wife who finally succumbed to her illness inspite of all my efforts to save her. I have a young son and now all my efforts are to restart my fallen business and get back so that I can start taking care of my son and rebuild my life. Since then, it has been a huge struggle to get bank loan and financial support from different avenues. Currently, I have been taking up small trading nature of jobs. I contacted ATPAR to seek help in restarting my Metal Ring Seal manufacturing business. I went through EDP Training through NSIC, supported by ATPAR. ATPAR helped me to prepare a revised Project Plan. I have ready orders and once the loan gets approved, or any financial support is received I will restart the business. In the meanwhile, I have also taken up Scrap Trading business.

"My commitment to support my husband in his business led me to do the EDP training"

"I am a mother with 5 family members, with the only source of income coming from a tea stall run by my husband." Mithlesh the mother, is a very dynamic and confident lady but could not take up a job to support her family as she has restricted mobility due to her disability. "I was determined to provide my children with a good quality education. I was keen to support my husband's business too so as to better manage the family expenditure. So I took things in my hands and decided to take part in the training provided by ATPAR and equip myself with the knowledge to run a business. Though travelling every day for the training and leaving the children alone was very challenging but the determination to go beyond my barriers and prove that I too can do business and add income to family made me complete my EDP Training successfully and get certificate from NSIC."

"I was good at cooking and upon ATPAR's suggestion decided to make Matri (salty snack) and sell at the tea stall. The tea shop being close to an auto rickshaw stand soon grew to have a line of customers, who were happy to get tasty savouries along with the tea. Our business has improved and so have the earnings. But I am looking to get more financial support to grow my business and build my own shop in my land. "

"Furthermore, I was unaware that I was eligible for an enhanced disability pension from the Government, ATPAR helped me acquire the same. A Wheel chair was provided to me, through the support from Cheshire Home, which has made my life comfortable and the increased earnings has helped the family live a better-quality life. With ATPAR support, I for the first time, recently went on very first holiday to Agra to see Taj Mahal along with all my family members!"

"Life gives you 2 options in every situation, either you give up or you fight back. I chose the second option"

Parvez Khan is my name, I am an MA in English literature. I run a Tuition bureau. I currently have 35 tutors working under me. "Why I chose to start a tuition bureau? ". In the beginning when I went as a tutor to people's homes, they would see my appearance and would not even let me take demo classes. Even though I am qualified, due to the bias in people's mind about persons with disability I was not able to take classes. I did not lose heart and turned this adversity into an opportunity. I decided that I will run a tuition bureau and have tutors under me who will go and take classes. This is just the beginning; EDP training has taught me to dream big and I am constantly finding ways of improving my business. I want to be working in the Disability sector as I feel I can be of help to a lot of people.

Rajendra lives by the motto "Never give up in life"

Polio at age 3 resulted in paralysis in both lower limbs. I was able to study till class 11 and had to discontinue due to bad health. I was fortunate that I learnt to repair mobile phones and went ahead and opened my own shop. This was the beginning of my entrepreneurial journey. The business was running under loss and I was unable to pinpoint where I was going wrong. I was lucky to find out about ATPAR and their EDP training at NSIC. The training helped me reassess my business and identify the problem areas. One big mistake was accumulation of stock. I realized that any stock that is lying idle needs to be sold. I cleared all pending stock before buying new stock again. This way I had control over my losses and very soon started making profit. I now make sure I am aware of the market trends and buy stock sensibly.

A young dynamic couple show the way to others specially bringing persons with Cerebral Palsy and other disabilities to come out of their homes and make choices to live a life they wish to live and show the world 'YES WE CAN!'

Meenu Mani, runs a social enterprise and is an entrepreneur with cerebral palsy and uses a wheelchair for her mobility. She started an NGO "Yes We Can" to enable persons with disabilities who are home bound to go out and be independent and enjoy life. Along with this she is also involved in her husband Samuel Mani's business "Neutron Computers" since she was married seven years ago.

Their company "Neutron computers" is a computer hardware and software solution provider. Apart from this they are the first and only Microsoft Authorized Refurbisher (MAR) in India, under a joint project of FICCI (SEDF) and AADI (NGO) with Microsoft. So far they have refurbished thousands of computers with support from Microsoft.

They believe in making a social impact via its Corporate Social Responsibility initiatives such as recycling old computers and providing the same to NGO's, charitable organizations, Students, Educational or research centres & small-scale businesses at concessional rates. Along with refurbishing computer systems, Laptops & their peripherals, they also refurbish other old equipments, such as AC's, Projectors, Photocopier, Fax, Refrigerator, Room Heater etc. and sell all the above refurbished items to NGO's, charitable organizations etc.

Hence, from 2005 onwards, I started providing content writing services and ever since then, I have been running my content writing and content consulting business online. Two things have helped me a lot: abundant connectivity and digital payment facilities.

"Keep track of your accounts and see your earnings grow" is Murari Lal's advice to all first time entrepreneurs.



Vishnu an example of "If there is a will there is a way"


I am Vishnu Kumar and I was deeply concerned as to "what will I do in life?".

I never got married due to lack of support by my family as I am paraplegic. I am proud of the fact that despite my disability I am a contributing member of my family. I am always looking for new opportunities and decided to be self-employed. I stared my own business of manufacturing jute bag, File folder, lap top bag, mobile pouch, etc. This is when I got in touch with ATPAR who are encouraging persons with disability to become self-employed and provide mentoring support to start small businesses. I am proud of my journey so far and wish to expand my business.
